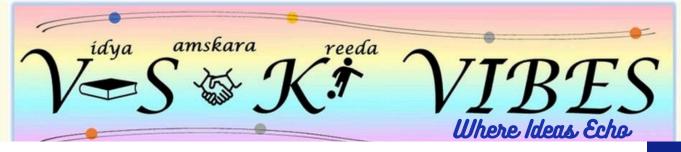

Faculty Lead Yoga Drive with Principal's Visionary Support

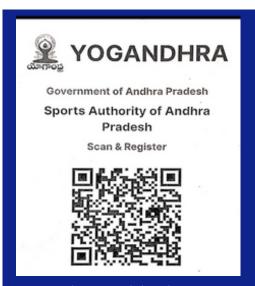
At Dr. V.S. Krishna Government Degree College (A), Visakhapatnam, three key faculty members took charge of the Yogandhara initiative with commendable leadership:
